2022 FEDERAL HOMELAND SECURITY GRANTS

IF YOU ARE INTERESTED IN APPLYING FOR A GRANT, HERE'S WHAT YOU SHOULD BE DOING NOW:

1. Obtain a Vulnerability Risk Assessment for your facility.

- You need a Vulnerability Risk Assessment (VRA) in order to apply for the grant. It is good for 3 years.
- You can get a FREE VRA through your County Prosecutor's Office.

2. Start drafting your Investment Justification (IJ).

- This year's form will not be released until very close to the application deadline. 4. All applicants must register for a free Unique Entity Identifier (UEI). Do this now!

- DUNS numbers will no longer be accepted.
- If you have never received a grant before, you must obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI).
- Register for your UEI at <u>SAM.gov | Home</u>

5. Additional information:

- We expect first-time applicants will receive bonus points so we encourage all non-profit organizations to apply.
- Previous grants have been for up to \$150,000. Some states may offer up to \$200,000 this year.
- This is a highly competitive grant process. That means that you must score in the top tier of applicants to be awarded a grant. Good planning and being very familiar with the application process will maximize your chances of an award.
